Reimagining our museum & illuminating the history of teaching in America

The focus of the physical space will be our inductees, with displays of artifacts around them representative of the history of teaching in America. Our inductees will be centered in the context of this profound narrative — featuring them as ambassadors who both honor the heritage of the profession and also usher it into the future. The virtual component of the museum will feature more information about inductees, highlights from history, and virtual tours of the one-room schoolhouse and National Memorial to Fallen Educators.

Strengthening our financial management and sustainability

All aspects of our financial accounting are being reviewed, and we are implementing procedures to strengthen our financial management, align with current best practices, and ensure NTHF is sustainable. In addition to our annual auction, we will launch a major fundraising and development campaign, establish new outreach capabilities, and enhance our "Wall of Fame" and "One in a Million" initiatives. Our revised website and media content will help attract potential donors; and during key times of the year, we will conduct targeted outreach campaigns to enable people to both support NTHF and show appreciation to educators who have made a difference in their lives.
